

# No more whining over preserving your best

Chances are pretty good that you won't have any leftover wine following your New Year's celebration. If so, you are stuck with two options: drink it or let it go to waste.

To preserve open wine, you must keep it free from oxygen. Restaurateurs own systems that spray inert gas into open wine bottles. This forms a barrier between wine and air, preventing the wine from spoiling.

Now, those at-home wine fanciers can do the same with the new **VineyardFresh** wine preservative.

VineyardFresh works with a unique spray-through cap and hinged extension tube. Just spray VineyardFresh into an open bottle of wine and then recork it. *Voila!* You've saved your wine for up to six months.

One bottle of VineyardFresh can preserve up to 50 bottles of wine.
